But the main focus was general pathology, and the course definitely did not disappoint in that respect (you can download the syllabus off of the Foundation web page) Lectures began at 8 AM and ran through 10 PM each day with an hour for lunch and two hours for dinner. The evening breakout reviews on unrelated topics, such as EM, immunohistochemistry, pathology of the dog, and a Thursday night gross exam proved almost as popular as our core topics, with over 50 participants showing up each night. More than one attendee bemoaned the fact that they couldn't spend the time they wanted on the beach due to the excellent program (that is what Saturday and Sunday are for, folks!)

Second Division Symposium a Success in Northern Argentina

The II Argentine Symposium of the CL Davis Foundation took place at the National Northeast University in the city of Corrientes on July 18 and 19. The Symposium was preceded by the sixth biannual national Argentine pathology meeting (RAPAVE). More than 120 pathologists, graduate students, practitioners and veterinary students participated in the event, coming from all over Argentina but also from Brazil, Chile, Paraguay and Uruguay.

Dr. Claus Buergelt coordinated the two-day

Foundation symposium on bovine pathology. Dr. Ted Clark presented a complete atlas of bovine diseases and syndromes mainly devoted to feedlot animals. Dr. Buergelt presented a series of special

bovine cases with great enthusiasm. These lectures were translated into Spanish by three enthusiastic colleagues (Dr. Guillermo Rimoldi from Buenos Aires University, and Drs. Gabriel Traveria and Eduardo Gimeno from La Plata University). Dr. Milton McAllister surprised everyone by teaching for hours in a perfect Spanish language on diseases of dairy and beef calves. Milton's presentations were instrumental to improved everyone's knowledge of neosporosis, a problem that is on the increase in South America.

In extracurricular activities in Corrientes, the Argentine Veterinary Pathology Association met in assembly on July 17 to discuss the inauguration of an independent CL Davis Foundation Study Center in La Plata and further activities in the cities of Tandil in 2009 and Buenos Aires in 2010. A dinner and a following "almost all-night long" party took place on July 18, with a superb demonstration of dancing abilities from different members of the international group.

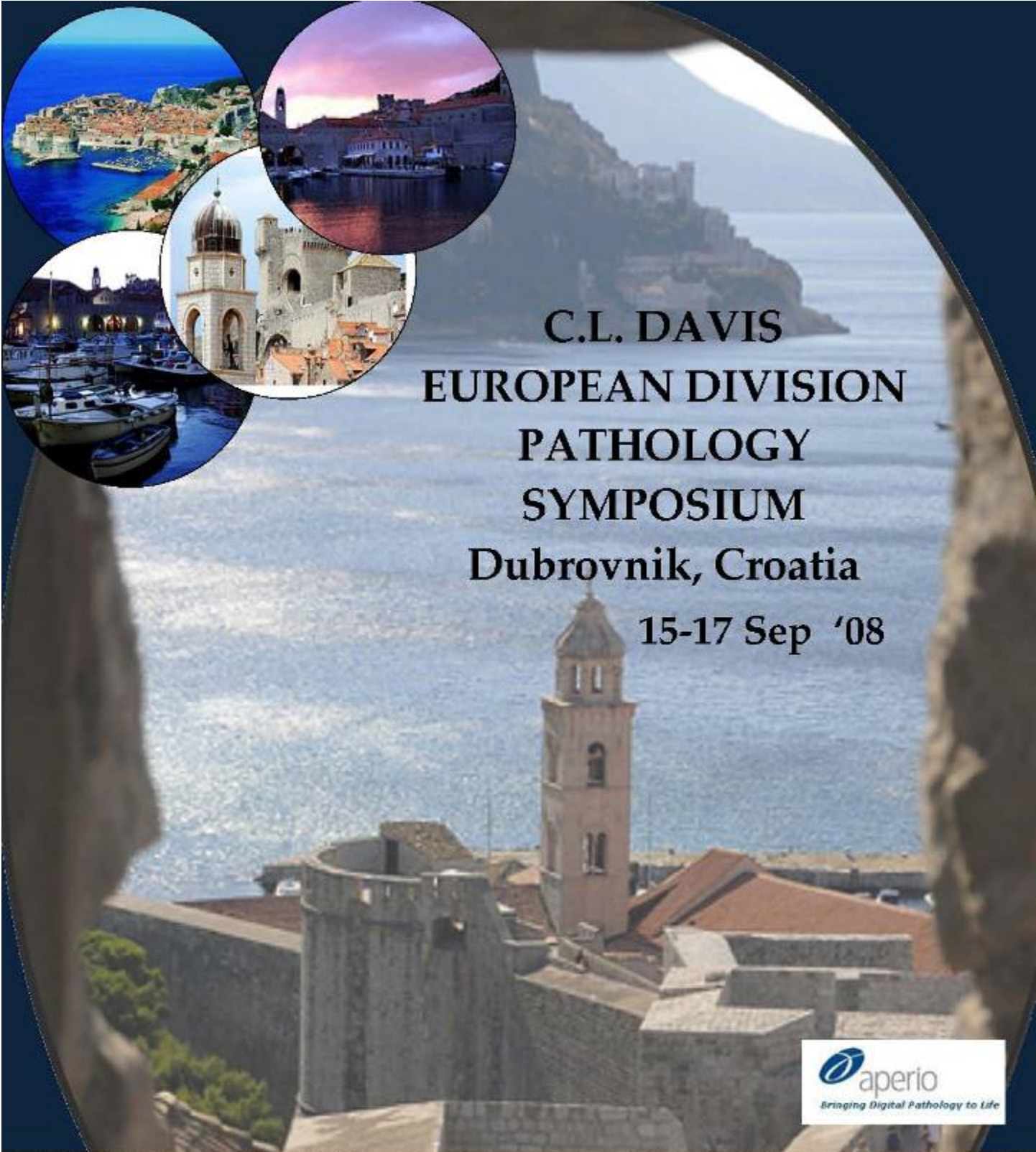
The next day, the group traveled to the veterinary school at La Plata, where on Monday, Dr. McAllister lectured on neosporosis and toxoplasmosis to more than 50 parasitologists and students. On July 23, Dr. Buergelt discussed the latest developments on paratuberculosis with Argentine colleagues. In addition, Claus donated a copy of McGavin et al's *Pathologic Basis of Veterinary Disease* to the Library of the Veterinary School.

This Corrientes meeting exemplifies the growing importance of the CL Davis Foundation for advancement of Veterinary Pathology around the world.

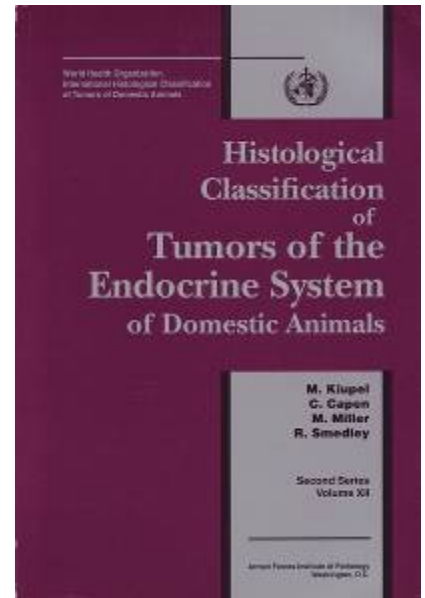
