**Residency Training in Veterinary Anatomic Pathology.** The Department of Infectious Diseases and Pathology at the College of Veterinary Medicine, University of Florida, has an opportunity for residency training in veterinary anatomic pathology beginning July 2016. The residency program consists of three years of training, based on diagnostic casework from the UF Veterinary Hospitals and the private sector, as well as multiple training seminars. Training is provided by seven board-certified faculty, with interests including dermatopathology, immunology, exotics/wildlife/zoo, oncologic, respiratory, aquatic animal, and molecular pathology. Residency training includes in-depth instruction on the diseases of horses, companion animals, zoo/wildlife species, and food animals, with opportunities to get further experience in laboratory animal pathology. The focus is on preparing residents to pass the American College of Veterinary Pathologists' certification examination. The current starting annual salary is \$32,500 plus medical insurance for the resident. There is an option for pursuit of graduate training in experimental pathology leading to a PhD degree after two years of residency training.
